8	SCHOOL TRAFFIC AND PARKING – ANDREW DUNLOP (PETT PARISH COUNCILLOR): Issues with parking and traffic around Guestling school have been mentioned at Pett Parish Council and to Fairlight Chair but not formally. Cllr Dunlop has had meetings with the Head of Guestling School and the Head of the Parents Association. Land that runs around the back of the school is possibly available for purchase, either for parking or to improve Forest School facilities – suggestion money is given from the three Parish Councils that the school serves. National Highways would need to be initially involved to ask what would be required as traffic management changes on an A road for an entrance/exit to a parking area Cllr Knatchbull -Hugessen proposed that the PC consider the idea, to extend Forest School facilities (with purchase of the land jointly by Guestling, Pett and Fairlight PC's) and then licence to the school	ALL

Notice has been published on website, Facebook and Pett on the Nett inviting residents to share their views regarding affordable housing (this has now closed). 11 responses received representing a range of views. The Working Party has offered to meet with those who have responded, so far 4 people have indicated they would like to do so and we aim to arrange meetings immediately after Easter. 	"Area checked around Rotherview Nursery, 2 days around there. The water is now flowing to the areas it should be. Up by Coghurst Farm within the public footpath there is the ditch line and header wall which needs a small amount of digging out. The 2 gullies on that corner run in to it. Rotherview nursery, the pipeline runs through Coghurst Lodge where a chamber can be found in the back garden, which then runs out to Coghurst caravan park into a ditch line there. Small amount of repair work to pipe is needed to improve this outfall. A lot of the gullies running along the road end up within this outfall which is why ponding occurs frequently. And finally, the hill section past Coghurst Caravan Park, all the gullies and pipework down here were completely full of grit and road stone travelling down the hill. It took some time but we've been able to clear a lot of the pipework out. here is an outfall chamber adjacent side of the road that takes a lot of the water coming down hill which again we've got running but needs further attention to increase water flow rate I was unable to get all the way to the top of the hill down to the sheer amount of cleaning these pipes needed, think we fell short by 5 – 6 gully connections from Jct Chowns Hill. I've been putting together a design to improve and repair the issues within the area's highlighted and will send it to my manager soon. Hopefully for the time being its improved the situation here. I am proposing quite a bit of work within the area to take place to improve the situation which can sometimes slow down the process, but I am still putting together the design work currently."
